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MINUTES

The April meeting of the Transportation Technical Committee was held on Thursday, April 13, 2023 at 1:30 p.m. at the Roanoke Valley-Alleghany Regional Commission, 313 Luck Avenue, SW, Roanoke, VA.

1. <u>WELCOME, CALL TO ORDER</u>

Chair Sexton called the meeting to order at 1:30 p.m.

2. ROLL CALL (including consideration of remote participation)

3. ACTION REQUESTED: APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA ITEMS

The following consent agenda items were distributed earlier:

Mr. Bryan Hill requested to add item 6A "Carbon Reduction Plan Funding" to the agenda.

<u>Motion</u>: by Mr. Frank Maguire to amend the agenda and add item 6A "Carbon Reduction Plan Funding"; seconded by Mr. Jonathan McCoy.

TTC Action: Motion carried unanimously.

<u>Motion</u>: by Mr. Maguire to approve the March 9, 2023 TTC Minutes, as presented; seconded by Mr. McCoy.

TTC Action: Motion carried unanimously.

4. CHAIR REMARKS

- Chair Sexton noted the Regional Commission is currently hiring a Transportation Director, more information can be found on the Commission's website.
- Chair Sexton noted that Mr. Will Crawford is no longer employed with Roanoke County, and he has accepted a position with the VDOT Salem District Planning Division.

5. ACTION REQUESTED: APPOINTMENT OF NEW SECRETARY

Chair Sexton remarked that since the Director of Transportation position is not yet filled, it would be appropriate to appoint an Interim Secretary to the TTC. He nominated Mr. Hill as the interim Secretary, noting that the bylaws state it must be a staff person. The Chair then called for any nominations from the floor. None were made.

Motion: by Mr. Michael Gray to appoint Mr. Hill as the interim TTC Secretary; seconded by Mr. Maguire.

TTC Action: Motion carried unanimously.

6. <u>ACTION REQUESTED: RECOMMENDATION ON THE FY2024 UNIFIED PLANNING</u> WORK PROGRAM

Mr. Hill reminded the Committee of their review of the draft FY24 UPWP at their March meeting. Since then, staff received information about a new federal Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) that will provide the RVTPO with funding to allocate directly to investments that support the goals of the CRP. Administering that program has been added to the UPWP. Additionally developing a Carbon Reduction Strategy will occur concurrently with the Commuter Assistance Program

Strategic Plan effort. Mr. Hill noted the following proposed changes to the staff recommendation on the Unified Planning Work Program:

- 1. Addition of a five-year update to the 2018 Roanoke Valley Greenway Plan.
- 2. Removal of the Washington Avenue Corridor Improvement Study and replacing it with a Regional Electric Vehicle Charging Study.
- 3. Addition of efforts relative to Appalachian National Scenic Trail Virginia's Triple Crown Segment Visitor Use Management (VUM) Plan, participation on the Appalachian Trail Pedestrian Bridge over Route 311 steering committee, and McAfee Knob related activities.

Ms. Megan Cronise thanked staff for their help and assistance with including the additional items to the UPWP.

Mr. Gray proposed the following correction to V.2) Federal Planning Considerations (page 3 of the UPWP):

Executive Order 14008 and M-21-28 advance environmental justice by stating that 40 percent of Federal investments flow to disadvantaged communities by working toward the goal that at least 40% of the benefits from many grants, programs, and initiatives flow to disadvantaged communities.

Ms. Cronise asked if it would be better for members to see how the staff recommended changes, and Mr. Gray's recommendation, are incorporated in the draft UPWP. Mr. Hill replied he would be happy to send the updated draft UPWP to TTC members for view prior to the release of the April RVTPO agenda packet.

<u>Motion</u>: by Megan Cronise to recommend to the RVTPO Policy Board the approval of the FY24 Unified Planning Work Program with the three changes recommended by staff and Mr. Gray's Justice 40 sentence change recommendation; seconded by Mr. Gray.

TTC Action: Motion carried unanimously.

6.A CARBON REDUTION PLAN FUNDING

Mr. Hill delivered a PowerPoint presentation on FY22 through FY24 available and preliminary allocations to the federal Carbon Reduction Program (CRP and included with the minutes). He asked the Committee to consider recommending three items to the Policy Board:

- 1. Approval of the FY22 and 23 available and FY24 preliminary (\$1,675,000) CRP funding allocations
 - a. Walnut Avenue Bicycle and Pedestrian Accommodations (5th Street to City/Town Limit) \$200,000
 - b. Roanoke River Greenway through Explore Park \$1,275,000

c. Walnut Avenue Bicycle and Pedestrian Accommodations (W. Lee Avenue to 1st Street) - \$200,000;

- 2. Moving the remaining \$88,226 in CRP funds into Balance Entry; and
- 3. Adjustment of the FY24-29 STBG Financial Plan to facilitate the movement of funds to the CRP.
 - a. Decrease Walnut Avenue Bicycle and Pedestrian Accommodations (5th Street to City/Town limit) funding by \$200,000 for a total allocation of \$2,068,142.
 - b. Decrease Roanoke River Greenway through Explore Park funding by \$1,275,000 for a total of \$3,0020,308.
 - c. Decrease Walnut Avenue Bicycle and Pedestrian Accommodations (W. Lee Avenue to 1st Street) funding by \$200,000 for a total allocation of \$417,610.

Mr. Josh Pratt asked since the three projects are being allocated CRP funds, would that mean that there is STBG money available that need to be reallocated? Chair Sexton answered that the presumption is that the money will be placed in the balance entry to be available for Round 6 in the fall, however he does recall a previous recommendation that when a certain project didn't receive additional funding there was an agreement that if additional funding becomes available that that project will receive it. Chair Sexton and Ms. Cronise suggested that the money be allocated to the Elizabeth Greenway project (City of Salem) instead of Balance Entry.

Chair Sexton commented that the CRP only shows three years of funding allocations and asked if future years and hypothetical amounts will be added to the spreadsheet as well? Ms. Stinnette responded that it would.

<u>Motion</u>: by Mr. Maguire to recommend to the RVTPO Policy Board the approval of:

- 1. The Carbon Reduction Plan Funding for FY22 to FY24;
- 2. The adjustments to the STBG Plan as a result of the CRP allocations; and
- 3. The allocation of the funds that became available as a result of the CRP to the Elizabeth Greenway Project, City of Salem; and placing the leftover money in the STBG's Balance Entry.

The motion was seconded by Ms. Cronise.

TTC Action: Roll call vote: Ayes - 14 (Fowler, Baker, McCoy, Cronise, Leftwich, Henry, D'Ardenne, McMillan, Sexton, Long, Maguire, Wagner, Gray, Pratt); Nays - 0; Abstentions - 0. Motion carried unanimously.

7. <u>ACTION REQUESTED: RECOMMENDATION ON AN AMENDMENT TO THE 2045</u> ROANOKE VALLEY TRANSPORTATION PLAN

Mr. Hill presented the staff report and highlighted that this amendment and the associated public engagement was being requested for the following reasons:

- 1. To address the substantial changes in the draft TIP from the first public engagement period (fall 2022).
 - 2. Amend the RVTP to revise an existing transit project with a name and scope change.
- 3. Amend the RVTP to include a new transit project on the Priority Projects to Pursue list.
 - 4. Amend the RVTP to include three new projects on the Funded Projects list.
 - 5. Amend the RVTP to include a new transit project.

<u>Motion</u>: by Mr. Wayne Leftwich to recommend to the RVTPO Policy Board the amendment to the 2045 Roanoke Valley Transportation Plan, as described in the staff report (pages 24 through 39 of the agenda packet); seconded by Mr. McCoy.

TTC Action: Motion carried unanimously.

8. CONGESTION MANAGEMENT PROCESS DRAFT 2023 REPORT

Mr. Jonathan Stanton gave a PowerPoint presentation on the Congestion Management Process (CMP and included with the minutes). The 2023 annual report includes updates which reflect the adoption of the 2045 Roanoke Valley Transportation Plan (RVTP), progress on congestion management strategies outlined in the CMP, and updated regional congestion trend data.

Chair Sexton asked who or what chooses priority corridors and corridors of concern. Mr. Stanton was uncertain and will follow up with a response.

9. OTHER BUSINESS

Chair Sexton announced the 2023 VDOT/DRPT Six-Year Improvement Program meeting will be held on May 16th at 4:00 p.m. at the Salem Civic Center Community Room (1001 Roanoke Blvd., Salem, VA 24153). Mr. Gray added that the comment period on the Commonwealth Transportation Board's website is open.

10. COMMENTS BY MEMBERS AND / OR CITIZENS

Mr. Hill reminded members about a virtual presentation from Erin Belt on National Electric Vehicle Infrastructure program funding on April 14th at 11 a.m.

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Introduction to the Carbon Reduction Program

Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) Purpose:

The purpose of the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) is to reduce transportation emissions through the development of State carbon reduction strategies and by funding projects designed to reduce transportation emissions.

- Incorporated into federal Law through the IIJA
- Development of a state Carbon Reduction Strategy is required by 11/15/23
- MPOs encouraged to obligate CRP funding toward projects that help implement Virginia's Carbon Reduction Strategy
- RVTPO staff will develop a Carbon Reduction Strategy, to be incorporated in the Roanoke Valley Transportation Plan, at a future date

VDOT Guidance and Draft RVTPO Carbon Reduction Program Budget

VDOT Guidance on expenditure of FY22-24 funding:

MPO's are encouraged to apply these funds to <u>existing projects</u> in the SYIP that have cost increases due to inflation or other issues so that the funds can be put to work quickly.

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
Rationale for Moving Funds between STBG and CRP

- The identified recipient projects were recently allocated additional RSTP/STBG funds by the TPO Board.
- These newly allocated funds have not been placed under project administration agreement yet with Roanoke County or Vinton.
- These projects are all eligible for Carbon Reduction funding.
- The schedules for these projects support immediate allocation and obligation of the Carbon Reduction funds.
- Allocation of Carbon Reduction funds will free up additional RSTP/STBG funds for programming by the TPO.

CRP FY25-29 Application Process: Concurrent with STBG Round 6

- Staff will develop a Carbon Reduction Strategy in the coming months, to align with the state.
- The CRP application process will be combined with STBG, which occurs later in 2023.

STAFF BRIEFING TTC Meeting May 11, 2023

SUBJ: 2020 Census Urbanized Areas Update and Changes to the Roanoke Valley TPO Area.

Each decennial Census, urban and rural areas are defined and calculated. The final definitions and areas are used by Federal, State, Regional, and Local agencies when applying policies, grants, and funding across the United States. The 2020 Census changed the minimum population threshold for urbanized areas, increasing the minimum population from 2,500 to 5,000. The 2020 Census also added a minimum housing unit qualification of 2,000 housing units for areas such as seasonal towns. Further, the extent of urbanized areas were defined by the following density thresholds:

- 425 housing units per square mile define the initial urban core.
- 200 units per square mile fill the remainder of the urban area.
- 1,275 housing units per squire mile ensures each qualifying urban area contains at least one high density nucleus.

The effects of changes to qualifying and threshold values on the Roanoke urbanized area are minor for the urban core but resulted in changes to the boundary areas of the urban area. Population and Population density (measured as population per square mile) both increased in Roanoke between 2010 and 2020:

- Roanoke urbanized area 2010 population and density: 210,111 and 1,692.0
- Roanoke urbanized area 2020 population and density: 217,312 and 1,731.6

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


Figure 1: FTA Census Map of Roanoke Urbanized Area 2010 and 2020 boundary

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


Figure 2: US Census boundaries, counties, and RVTPO area as seen on ArcGIS web map.
